In the afternoon session, OEA Assistant Executive Director Kevin Flanagan will provide training and assistance to members interested in writing for one of the OEA Affiliate Grants. Kevin will explain the deadlines and purposes of the different grants and provide assistance in the grant-writing process.

The evening session will be led by ECOEA President Tracy Lemus Santos and Vice President Julie Nelson. In this networking and brainstorming session, leaders will discuss and share ideas about how to be an effective local, encourage member involvement, and leadership ideas. OEA Carol Price will present how to conduct elections. If your local has not been holding levels for representation at all levels of the organization, this is an excellent opportunity to find out how to get your members involved outside of the local level, and to learn about the laws governing elections.

<u>Session 5 OEA Constitution and Bylaws Compliance Work Session Session 6 Building Rep Training</u>

In our afternoon session, members will bring their local C& B and work to on bring their C& B into compliance with OEA under the guidance of OEA Labor Relations Consultants.

In the evening, new Building Reps and interested members will learn about member rights and protections, how to be an effective leader, and the role of a Building Rep in the association.

She represents ECOEA Unit 3 on the OEA Board of Directors. She has inspired and encouraged new leaders with her energy and passion, and has worked tirelessly to strengthen our association. While we will miss her as president, she will continue her service in the position of Past-President on the ECOEA Executive Board. Thank you Angela!

Membership in the OEA Women's' Caucus is open to ALL OEA members at all levels----students, actives, and retirees for an annual membership fee of \$15 per year from September 1 through August 31. Please consider joining this Caucus.

There are three general membership meetings per year. These membership meetings include a business meeting followed by an informational program. For this school year the meeting dates were/are Saturday, December 6 during the lunch break at the OEA RA, Saturday, March 14, 2015, and May 30, 2015 with the latter two meetings held in the OEA Building at noon.

The Caucus also conducts fundraisers at the OEA RAs and uses the profits to support groups and/or actions that promote/support women's causes. At the March meeting, after hearing a presentation about Girls on the Run (grades 3-5) and Girls on Track (grades 6-8) which is in the Edison School in Dayton, a contribution of \$1000 was made to the Edison program.
