Coming up on **Saturday**, **February 9**, is our **Retirement Workshop** at the Courtyard Marriott at Belden Village. We begin with a complimentary breakfast buffet at 8:45 AM. After a brief general session where you will hear from NEA Member Benefits and OEA-Retired, there will be two break-out sessions offered- one for STRS members, and one for SERS members. Each session features a speaker who will address the upcoming changes in their respective retirement system and what this means to you as a member. You may submit a question in advance, and the speakers will take questions from the floor. While this workshop is not meant to be an individual counseling session, our speakers are most knowledgeable and will provide an overview of the changes as well as individual concerns. Guests are welcome for a nominal fee.

On Friday, March 8, our program feature is our Annual Legislative Dinner, again held at the Courtyard Marriott at Belden Village. This is a unique opportunity to dine with and talk face-to-face with the legislators and state Board of Education members who represent the districts in our six county ECOEA area. After a buffet dinner, the legislators and BOE members move to a panel where they answer questions and speak to topics submitted by the members in attendance. We have had a great response from the legislators who genuinely want to hear your concerns about public education. After the program, we transition to a less formal setting for hospitality and networking with a DJ, snacks, and door prizes. There is a special rate for those members who chose to stay overnight at the hotel.

Two additional program events are our Summer Leadership Workshop and our Fall Legal Update. This summer we will offer treasurer training, Local Leaders Roundtable, and Building Rep training. We are very excited to have OEA attorney Kathleen McKinley lead a session on the legal aspects of the new Teacher Evaluation System. She will again join us at our Fall Legal Update in October at the Hartville Kitchen. Anyone who has heard Kathleen comes away saying that EVERY member should hear what she has to say. All events are open to you as an Association member at no charge. Simply make your \$10 deposit when you make your reservation and it will be returned to you as you walk in. Other benefits of your Association membership are scholarship opportunities from ECOEA, OEA, and NEA, grants to locals, political action, and leadership development. ECOEA is there for you with services to inform and assist you in your profession.
