Although the context clues were obvious, I admit I had to Google the exact meaning of "bellwether." The definition is "someone or something that leads others or an indicator of trends." Ohio, of course, is a bellwether state when it comes to elections. We are the pulse of the nation and have the longest streak for voting for the winning presidential candidate.

And he looked at me through the rear view mirror and said, 'You don't have to know who the president of Ethiopia is. The president of Ethiopia can't hurt your children. The president of Ethiopia can't help your children. The president of the United States impacts everyone in the world, but we don't get to vote for them. You do. All we can do is hope that you choose wisely.'

How blessed we are to live in the time and place that we do. We have the power to elect candidates who support our students. We have the responsibility to elect candidates that will help children in Ohio, the United States, and around the world.


